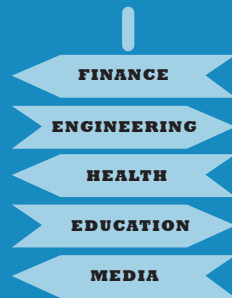


DELAWARE PATHWAYS

HIGH SCHOOL

Grades 9-12



CAREER EXPLORATION

Armed with knowledge about their options, students choose their Pathways program, which provides 3-6 school courses in a program of study aligned to labor market demand.

Students now can receive early career opportunities in and out of school, job shadowing, mock interviews, internships, resume writing, and more.



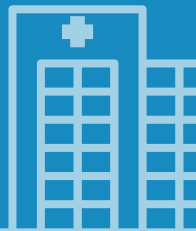
CAREER PREPARATION

Through dual enrollment or AP courses, students can earn college credit at Delaware colleges and universities.

Career counseling helps students learn more about employment and postsecondary opportunities upon completion of their pathway.

Students can work directly with businesses in an internship, co-op, or apprenticeship, which will give them relevant work experience in their career area.

The ongoing coursework will allow students to receive a relevant industry-recognized credential.



CAREER AWARENESS

Through elective coursework, online platforms, site visits, and guests speakers, students begin thinking about a career as early as middle school.



MIDDLE SCHOOL

Grades 5-8



By the time they graduate high school, students already have an industry-recognized certification, advanced standing at a local college or university, and relevant work experience. They have choices in deciding the best next step for them with opportunities for additional technical training, an associate degree, bachelor's degree, or more.

The Delaware Career Pathway System represents the alignment of rigorous and high-quality education, training, and support services for students and adults to accelerate their education and career goals, demonstrate success in a full range of secondary and post-secondary education options, and pursue a meaningful career within a state or regional economy.
